Dean's Council

- Considers matters referred to it by the Dean, the Academic Council, Faculty Council, Committees of the School of Medicine, and/or individual faculty member.
- Uses *ad hoc* committees to address Dean's Council responsibilities.



Academic Council

Composition:

- Dean of the Medical School
- 4 members of Dean's Council
- Faculty Council President
- 4 Faculty Representatives elected by Faculty Council

Meets quarterly

- In the event that any standing committee reporting to the Faculty Council (FC) should find itself at an impasse with the FC regarding programs or policies, the issue in question will be referred to the Academic Council (AC).


