Gayle Greve Hunt School of Nursing Programs:

Bachelor of Science in Nursing - By August 31, two years after the academic year of matriculation. **Master of Science in Nursing** - By August 31, three years after the academic year of matriculation.

Graduate School of Biomedical Sciences Programs:

Post-Baccalaureate Certificate in Biomedical Sciences - By August 31, one year after the academic year of matriculation. **Master of Science in Biomedical Sciences -** By August 31, two years after the academic year of matriculation.

Paul L. Foster School of Medicine Program:

Doctor of Medicine - By August 31, four years after the academic year of matriculation.

Transferred-in and transferred-out students are not included in the Graduation Rate calculation.
